





- It can be divided into 5 sections:
- 1. Wilderness of Sinai (1-10)
- 2. Travel to Paran (10-12)
- 3. Wilderness of Paran (13-19)
- 4. Travel to Moab (20-21)
- 5. Wilderness of Moab (22-36)

→ Question to consider: How does my foolishness or faithfulness influence or affect God's plan for my life?














## Numbers 22-36: Wilderness of Moab

The story of Balaam is the answer to that question.







22:6:

2 Peter 2:16: "rebuked for his own transgression; a speechless donkey spoke with human voice and restrained the prophet's madness"




### Balaam's 4 Oracles or "Curses"



- 1. Numbers 23:9-10: "your offspring shall be like the dust of the earth."
- 2. Numbers 23:19: "He has blessed and I cannot revoke it."


### Balaam's 4 Oracles or "Curses"



- 3. Numbers 24:9: God will bless those who bless them and curse those who curse them.
- 4. Numbers 24:17: One who is coming, a ruler who will crush the foreheads of Moab. This isn't just an affirmation of Genesis 12, this is an affirmation of Genesis 3.

### Balaam's 4 Oracles or "Curses"

→ While Israel is down in the camp complaining, they are totally unaware that in the mountains overhead, God is blessing them.

→ Balaam is brought up multiple times in Scripture as one who causes God's people to be led astray for personal gain.



→ The book ends as they are about to enter the land and Moses is about to die. Before they go in, he is going to give them his last words and that is what Deuteronomy is about.

# Thoughts on Numbers

• Numbers is an example of unfaithfulness which we are not to follow.

The choices we make to obey or disobey God matter.

 You can make choices to put yourself in a place where God can bless you and express more love to you or you can remove yourself from that blessing by disobedience.

# Thoughts on Numbers

- Our relationship with God is that-a relationship. His unconditional and conditional love aren't contradictions. They are part of a relationship.
- We are loved unconditionally in Christ, but we must not presume upon God's forgiveness as if what we do doesn't matter.

# Discussion/Sharing Time

- 1. Do you struggle with complaining about day-to-day things? What does that communicate to God about your trust in Him and your faith in His plans? How does complaining open a door for rebellion against God?
- 2. In what ways do we presume upon God's forgiveness and not consider the consequences for our sin? How can we rightly understand the forgiveness we have in Christ with the reality that our sin can still have consequences?

3. How should the example of the people in Numbers motivate us to guard our hearts against rebellion and to press on in faith?

#### Three main points:

- 1. We must continue in faith.
- 2. Our decisions matter.
- 3. God will remain faithful to His covenant.

→ We can rest in God's faithfulness to His promises and that is our hope. But we are not to be lazy in our pursuit of Him. What we do matters, and we ought to "work out our salvation with fear and trembling."

#### Quote from The Chronicles of Narnia

"But what would have been the good?" Aslan said nothing.

"You mean," said Lucy rather faintly, "that it would have turned out all right — somehow? But how? Please, Aslan! Am I not to know?"

"To know what would have happened, child?" said Aslan. "No. Nobody is ever told that."

"Oh dear," said Lucy.

"But anyone can find out what will happen," said Aslan. "If you go back to the others now, and wake them up; and tell them you have seen me again; and that you must all get up at once and follow me – what will happen? There is only one way of finding out."

→God doesn't want us to live in regret over the past or fear of the future. As the Lord tells Peter when he asks about what will happen in the future, "You follow Me!" (John 21:22)
